Letter from Our Spiritual Assistant – Br. Lawrence LaFlame, OFM. Conv.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Francis,

I was thinking just the other day that 2015 has arrived and it did not seem so long ago that the new millennium was being anticipated (Y2K and all the rest). The ancient Romans remind us *tempus fugit* (i.e., "time flies") and don't we all know it.

Where that leaves me is with the thought that we cannot keep putting things off for, before we know it, it will be 2020 and we'll still be saying "I still need to do (start!). . . . This is especially important in our daily lives, but even more important in our spiritual lives. Our relationship with God must be of primary importance whether we are 15 or 85. ON THE VALUE OF THE THIRD ORDER

Consider how Divine Providence made use of St. Francis to renew the world. Sensuality and avarice had shaken the very foundations of Christian life. To counteract them, St. Francis founded his order on poverty and renunciation. The First Order of the Friars Minor and the Second Order of the Poor Clares were to practice these virtues by taking vows and living in religious communities. Those called to the religious life in either of these two orders were to be outstanding examples and incentives to the world. The Third Order was intended for Christians living in the world who were desirous of assuring their salvation and supplied ways and means by which they, too, could counteract the dangers of sensuality and avarice.

The late Popes from Pius IX to Pius XII have declared that nothing could be more pleasing to them than that the Third Order be spread far and wide.

Consider how the Third Order protects its members from the dangers of the world. Pope Leo XIII revised the rule, so that its practices of piety and mortification can be more easily observed by every Christian, also by those who belong to the working class. Twelve Our Fathers are said daily; holy Mass is attended daily; if possible, the sacraments are received frequently; and two extra fast days are observed during the year. Wise precepts are laid down for the practice of virtues which will counteract sensuality and avarice, as well as promote submissions to temporal and spiritual authority. Modern Christians who are really interested in their salvation do well to unite in Christian brotherhood to achieve these purposes. -- Ask yourself whether you are really living according to the rule.

Consider the powerful aids which are provided in the Third Order. In it people associate with others who have the same purpose in mind and publicly pledge themselves to that purpose. Their example encourages them mutually, their common association is a constant stimulus. The members say a common prayer, and God looks upon that common prayer of millions with favor. At the monthly meetings we receive useful instruction. We are joined in one spiritual family and in a certain communion of graces with all the children of St. Francis, even with our Seraphic Father and the numerous saints of his three orders who have already been glorified. With what confidence may the Tertiaries call upon their sainted forebears to assist them! -- As a Secular Franciscan do not forget to recommend your intercession for the souls of the departed members of the order. –

The Most Reliable Understanding of Heaven

I have to say that I have never been to heaven and returned to describe it. But God has given us an understanding of what it will be like. Of course, heaven will be infinitely better than anything we can describe. The key element is that love is the central concept that best describes our relationship with God. Therefore the most perfect description of heaven is perfect and

eternal union with Him. We can best understand God's love by our loving relationships with each other—imperfect as they yet will be.

We know that heaven is not a place or location. It is, in essence, union with God. This union perfects us as humans, but in spirit. There remain no imperfections and nothing that could detract from that perfect union with God.

If we are all in perfect union with God, then we are all in perfect union with each other. We cannot comprehend that in terms of experience, but it definitely makes sense based on what we know of God and what Jesus has revealed to us. Heaven is perfection—no matter how we look at it.

Love One Another

I've talked with more than a few Christian fundamentalists. Their concept of heaven could best be described as "union with God—no one else." Their rationale is that once we have completed our earthly journey, we don't need anyone else to make us happy. Others would just get in the way and detract from our giving glory to God. Whenever I hear that explanation, I think they have created a rather insecure God who wants all our attention for eternity. It is such a shrunken image of the magnificence of heaven that God has prepared.

John spoke God's word in a perfect statement that answers the question: "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God" (1 Jn 4:7).

Amazing, isn't it? God is telling us to love one another. We might automatically assume that our most important love should be directed to God. But no! God says that our love must be directed to one another!

Think of it this way: What mother or father would not be ecstatic to see how much their sons and daughters love one another? What could make them happier? Would loving parents tell their children that they must concentrate on them and not one another? Truly loving parents would say, "Loving one another is the greatest gift you could give us."

And so it would appear that heaven will be union with God and with each other in perfect love. It means that eternity will be the revelation not only of all God's love and goodness, but also of all that we have meant to each other. It pleases God when we love one another.
